

Alumni Spotlight: George Boston (YLJ 2018/NextGen 2023)

As a dual graduate of the Youth Leadership Jacksonville and Next Generation programs, **George Boston** (YLJ 2018/NextGen 2023) shared how much he loved the exposure he received to the city.

"Prior to YLJ, I had never visited the City Council Chambers, seen first appearance court, or the county jail. I had never been on a riverboat tour either! Through YLJ, I've become so much more aware of our community's history and all that Jacksonville has to offer and being a part of the NextGen program was one of the most impactful things I've ever done in my life - I was able to

connect with fellow young professionals in industries all across Jacksonville. The summer program defied my expectations in the most spectacular way possible. Every program day caused me to challenge my own thinking and because of that, I developed a much deeper appreciation for our community and its history. During one of my NextGen program days, we got to hear a speech from Mayor Deegan. This was my first time hearing a speech from a politician in real life and not on TV. I just remember being so impressed with her leadership and communication skills that it inspired me to take more an interest in our local government," said George.

"I cannot speak highly enough of LJ and the amazing staff and volunteers that help make the magic happen for our leaders; however, the most unique thing about my experience was by far the friends that I have made. I know everyone says this, but my class was the best class! In fact, before our last program day, my class came together and raised over \$500 to sponsor a member in the upcoming NextGen class, a true display of camaraderie. I felt that our group really clicked the second we all got together and I am so happy to say that I have made lifelong friends from this program.

"Transformation is my biggest reason for recommending YLJ and NextGen to people. While this word is sometimes overused, I do believe that it is what summarizes these experiences the best. 



In Sympathy



Our condolences to the family and friends of **Betty Holzendorf** (LJ 1978) upon her passing on February 29. Betty was a Jacksonville native who graduated from Matthew W. Gilbert High School at the young age of 16. She received a B.S. in Biology from Edward Waters University, a Master's of Art in Biology from Atlanta University, and a Master's in Education Administration from University of North Florida.

Following Betty's roles as a public school teacher and administrator at Edward Waters, she began a government and political career as the City of Jacksonville's Affirmative Action Officer and as a City Council liaison for Mayor Jake Godbold in the 1970s. Betty became the first African American woman from Jacksonville to be elected to the Florida House of Representatives, where she served from 1988 to 1992. She was then elected to the Florida State Senate in 1992,

representing District 2, which included parts of Alachua, Clay, Duval, Putnam, and St. Johns counties. Her platform was helping senior citizens, and securing funds for local and collegiate education.

In 1998, Betty was named Democratic Leader Pro Tempore and Legislator of the Year. In 2007, Mayor John Peyton recruited Betty to serve as co-chair of the steering committee for the anti-crime Jacksonville Journey. Betty was known for her focus and willingness to help create economic programs for Jacksonville residents and beyond. She was instrumental in legislation that reestablished the Florida A&M University (FAMU) College of Law. Her support of FAMU led to being honored with the President's Award (1990), the Meritorious Achievement Award (1994), and as a Honorary Alumna. Her community service included founding the Northside Civic Association. Betty was an active member of several organizations including the National Council of Negro Women, National Conference of Black State Legislators, Jacksonville Chamber of Commerce, NAACP, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority; she also served on the Board of Directors of the FAMU Foundation.

Betty's Leadership Jacksonville family includes her son **Kevin Holzendorf** (LJ 2006), daughter-inlaw **Tracee Holzendorf** (LJ 2008), and grandchildren **Kevin Holzendorf, Jr.** (YLJ 2015) and **Kenadee McCallum** (YLJ 2017).


