"What I enjoyed most about the program is how it allowed you to see past yourself and into the bigger picture of the community around you. Putting yourself into another's shoes is never an easy task - it was an eye-opener for me.

"YLJ has positively influenced my professional goals by teaching me the importance of being curious about people and the world around me. It has taught me to be more open

to discomfort, which has led me to be an advocate for myself and others," said Gift.

Gift plans on studying Biochemistry at the University of South Florida and her future career aspirations are focused in the medical field, as a Physician or a Pharmacist.

**Madison Mescal** (YLJ 2022) shared how her expectations for the YLJ program were surpassed. "It was a great experience whether we were listening to speakers or engaging in activities," said Madison.

"I enjoyed the program day where we traveled to Brooks' Rehabilitation the most. While at Brook's we got to experience what it is like to be in other's shoes and learned about different types of therapy. This program is what inspired me for the career path I want to go into.



"As an Alumni member, the program has influenced my goals as I have since become very interested in the history of Jacksonville and surrounding towns. Before YLJ, I wanted a different occupation, and now, I strive to have a job where I can work with people and give back to the community. Once in college, I plan to be a part of different organizations and help where I can," shared Madison.

Madison plans to study Kinesiology at the University of North Florida and would like to be a Physical Therapist.



**Taylor Thigpen** (YLJ 2022) learned about the Youth Leadership Jacksonville program from his school dean and was immediately intrigued. "I was looking forward to meeting new friends and young leaders across the Jacksonville area and expanding my knowledge of our local community and the challenges it faces. This program was astounding and instrumental in my development for making a change in the Jacksonville area and furthering my nonprofit work in the local community," said Taylor.

"Being a YLJ alumnus, I met leaders who made life long connections. From owning my own houseplant business, I was able to connect with business leaders from our program days to help serve the population of Jacksonville. I also furthered my

skill of grant writing from learning about the financial needs of our community, and recently I won a \$20,000 grant for a local nonprofit.
